- After the immediate relief we quickly moved to rebuilding houses and infrastructures for the needy people
- These are the list of village development committees(VDC) in which the houses were built during the establishment of Mandala.

Kadambas VDC : 5 houses

Hagam VDC: 3 houses

- Mankha VDC: 1
- **KADAMBAS VDC:** 68 km far from the capital city and attached to Araniko highway. 900 households were ruined and it's about 99% of household of the VDC. 22 people died due to this earthquake.

Inauguration of Rebuilding by Prachanda



The first house we built was inaugurated by former Prime Minister and Unified-Maoist Chairperson Mr. Puspa Kamal Dahal – Prachanda along with other leaders of Maoist party. The first house built was of 101 years old Kul Bahadur Magar

- Kul Bahadur Magar is the one who was victim of this earthquake, now is gradually recovering but his house is totally damaged and there is no one to take care of this couple. He belongs to a minor community and has a wife of 94 years age.

Rehabilitation Centre for Disabilities and Earthquake Victims, Chautara



- There are many with-born disabilities and post-accident disabled in Sindhupalchowk district who were directly affected by this destructive earthquake. They are sheltered here in chautara, headquarter of Sindhupalchowk. 34 disabled are sheltered, educated, provided food & looked after very well.

Conservation of Chepang Community



These children are from a very unique tribe of Nepal, Chepang, who are considered to be rich in culture & history but in state of endanger. Gaambesi Chepang Conservation Centre in Chitwan is providing food, shelter and education to 135 Chepang kids from 4 districts (Gorkha, Makawanpur, Chitwan, Dhading) of Nepal. Most of the children are directly affected by the recent earthquake, losing their home and family.

Introduction of Chepang

- An isolated tribal group, Chepang, mainly inhabiting the rugged ridges of the Mahabharat mountain range of central Nepal.
- The Chepang led a nomadic life, doing some fishing and hunting.
- Today, they live in sheds made of tree branches and cultivate crops such as maize and millet.
- They still have customs akin to nomadic life, such as using traps to catch birds and gathering various forest products.
- For at least half of the year, they eat quite well as a result of their agricultural efforts.
- However, for the other half of the year, they exist on the products of the forests and remain suspended on the edge of starvation.

Conservation Centre & Hostel for Chepang Children

- 135 children in the conservation centre
- 20 students in high school level
- 5 in +2 Level
- Remaining 110 in primary level
- Rs 25000 per year needed for +2 students academic expenses
- Daily Food in need- up to 90kg rice per day
- In need of Clothing & hygienic environment
- For 3 months - Rs 1,00,000 for clothing, hygienic tools like soaps, towel, girls sanitary and annually Rs 1,25,000 for academic expense of 5 +2 level students



Rebuilding & Updating Education Centre



- Build schools & one hostel in Gorkha, Chitwan & Sindhupalchowk
- Update the education model and maintain quality service
- Monitor teachers and teaching materials
- Provide supplies, text books, technology and internet facilities for students
- Provide foreign volunteers for teaching & training
- Like sports, art, personal development, computers
- Rejuvenating the school environment in these schools

Drinking water supply project

There are different impacts seen after the earthquake among them the sources of water has been shifted as the villagers are totally dependent on the spring water. We have seen the miserable problem of drinking water in our project area. Thus we have completed drinking water supply project in some of the area but lack of adequate budget there are still left to be done in some area.

- Nepal government recently has declared to provide 2 lakhs for the earthquake victims and as a first installment government already **started** to allocate 50000 likewise the consolation amount will be distributed in 3 installments.
